

Year 5 Newsletter

Autumn 1



During our geography lessons this half-term, we will focus on the origins and formation of rivers, together with their importance to human life and the cities that have built around them. To support this learning, we will begin to learn about the water cycle, building on our learning in Year 4 about the properties of solids, liquids and gases. We will use water to paint with and will also use it to make music.

English

Linking with our river studies in Geography, our class text this half-term is 'The Wind in the Willows,' by Kenneth Grahame (first published in 1908.) It is a wonderful story that explores the relationships between a group of friends (Ratty, Mole, Badger and Toad) as they get up to mischief, exploring the world together.

We will use this story to help us develop our own ability to tell stories, writing a story narrative that explores a new adventure for the group. This work will build on our descriptive learning as we seek to improve the images we create for our readers.

To support this, our key focuses will be on the use of paragraphs to change time or place, and using both action and speech to develop the characters within our stories. We can't wait to get started.

<u>Maths</u>

In Year 5, your children will continue with Singapore Maths.

During this term, the key focus of our Maths learning will be place value as we begin to work with numbers to 1,000,000. We will use this understanding to find more or less, and round numbers to the nearest 10,000, 100,000 or 1,000,000.

Following this, we will continue to work on our written methods of addition and subtraction.

Weekly timetable tests will also continue. Can we ask that parents support their child further by allowing them to access Times Table Rock Stars regularly at home?

Reading

We know that at times that this is not an easy task at home, but recognise the great impact this has on learning. Thank you for your commitment with this. To celebrate this, children that are able to read at least 5 times a week at home will be entered into the Star Readers draw every Friday, for their chance to win a book to take home.

In school, all children will continue to have daily guided reading sessions, as well as individual readers with the class teacher or support staff.

Homework

Please look out for your child's learning log. They need to choose one task each week and tasks should be signed off by an adult at home before it is returned.

Homework will be given out every Friday, and collected back in every Wednesday.

Science

For our Science topic this half term we will be asking the question, 'Could you be the next CSI investigator?'

We will look at changing states, including reversible and irreversible changes. From this, we will explore how investigators use science to catch a criminal, including finger printing and DNA.
